Yet despite being a nation full of beauty and potential, Botswana also faces many underlying challenges. With one out of three people in the nation HIV positive, life expectancy has dropped from 72 to 39 since 1990, and AIDS/HIV has left 80,000 orphans. With the world's second highest HIV infection rate, funerals have tragically become the dominant social gathering in many communities.

- Campus ministry to flourish and to continue by raising God honoring disciples.
- Mature beliefs free from tribal or animistic thinking.
- Discipling indigenous Church leaders to protect from syncretism.
